Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup

Friday, Saturday & Sunday – August 19-21, 2022

The Cape Charles Cup is <u>THE</u> Cruising event for serious Racers and <u>THE</u> Racing event for serious Cruisers!

The Saturday leg is from Little Creek to Cape Charles. Enjoy the after-race awards social at The Oyster Farm Marina at Kings Creek, have dinner and drinks with friends, and sightsee or shop at the marina or in Cape Charles. Dock at Oyster Farm Marina to be closer to the after-race social or Cape Charles Town Harbor for a deep-water solution! After-race activities to be determined. A slip reservation will be made for you based on your request indicated on your entry form. There's no need to call the marina to make a separate reservation. Hail on VHF-16 when approaching the docks. Enjoy race hospitality. There will be a shuttle service making a continuous loop between the Cape Charles Town Harbor and Oyster Farm from 1700 to 2200 hours on Saturday.

Entry Fee: \$115.00 if received by July 22nd, \$165 if received thereafter. In accordance with the process described in your event registration confirmation email, provide a photo of the boat and/or crew by July 22nd to be included in the yearbook. Entry fee includes registration, one Cape Charles Cup hat and short sleeve tee shirt, a Cape Charles Cup skipper's bag loaded with useful and interesting stuff. The post-race socials are still to be determined as we navigate the Covid restrictions going forward.

Entries and Deadline: Online entry at www.CCCup.net. Entries close at 1200 hours on August 12th.

Competitors' Meeting: Social @ 1800 hours – **Skippers' Meeting** @ 1830 hours on Friday, August 19th at East Beach Bayfront Club. 4550 E. Beach Dr. Norfolk, VA 23518

Courses: Saturday: Starting on the north side of the Thimble Shoal Channel approximately 2 miles north of "1LC" and finishing at the Cape Charles entrance buoy. Sunday: Starting in the vicinity of the Cape Charles entrance buoy and finishing off Buckroe. In the event of light air, the race committee may relocate the starting line closer to the first mark and/or shorten course at the mark.

Divisions: PHRF A, B, C, N (2HS-double headsails allowed) and N (1HS-single headsail only) with current PHRF rating (www.phrfchesbay.org). PHRF Nonspinnaker classes will receive an 18 sec/mi handicap bonus for Cape Charles Cup Trophy calculations. Cruising (single headsail only), open to monohull boats that do not have a valid PHRF rating and/or skippers that race only occasionally (courtesy rating available from race organizers and shall not be subject to challenge). Handicap adjustments will be made for previous multiple race winners in the Cruising Division. ORC Cruiser with valid rating (https://orcches.org/orc-cruiser-requirements.html). CMA/Multihull (no beach-launched vessels) with valid rating (courtesy ratings will be assigned by CMA: http://www.chesapeakemultihulls.org/). A division must have 4 entries by July 20th to be included.

Time: First Flag = 1000 hours Saturday and Sunday.

Rules: The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*. All monohulls must meet US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements for Near Shore (<u>Monohull-SER-2022.0.pdf (broadbaysailing.org)</u> as modified in the Sailing Instructions. All multihulls must meet US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements for Near Shore (<u>Multihull-SER-2022.0.pdf (broadbaysailing.org)</u> as modified in the Sailing Instructions.

Prizes: Daily class awards based on number of entries. Cape Charles Cup awards for the best total corrected time (Divisions with at least 13 entries). Saturday trophies awarded at the post-race social. Sunday and overall trophies awarded at a BBSA meeting to be determined later in the year.
