And I had a lifeline break in the middle of the night while sailing under spinnaker from Old Plantation light to Wolf Trap light in 15 knots of wind. A crew sitting on the rail called out "captain, I just broke your lifeline." I thought that it must have just come unfastened somehow, but in the light of day I could see that corrosion at a tiny crack had eaten _ through the head of the swivel, and that it took just a little pressure to break it completely. Had that lifeline failed while doing its job (or NOT doing its job), we would have most likely had a live man overboard drill – a real thrill while sailing fast at night with the chute up.

Mike's place is easy to find. It's in the East Beach Shopping Center (on the left after you drive northbound across Shore Drive's Pretty Lake bridge). Mary Moore's East Beach Trading Company is in the same center, and many of you will remember the BBSA meeting we held there.
