#### From the Commodore

The Broad Bay Sailing Association and Little Bay SmallBoats are pleased to announce the 2008 Wednesday Night Races:

Rules: Races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing for

2005 - 2008, Little Bay SmallBoats Sailing Instructions 2008 and this Notice of

Race.

Entries: Open enrollment; one person aboard each boat must be over 18. Boat must be

monohull no longer than 20 feet but not less than 9 feet. (Centerboard only).

Registration: Open to BBSA members and associate members only.

Entry Fee: Included in the \$35 BBSA membership or \$10 associate membership fee.

Classes: 1st monohull, 2nd monohull, one-design. Monohull class splits will be based on

the number of entries in each class.

Ratings: Ratings and scoring will be according to US Sailing's Portsmouth Yardstick,

2008. For scoring, a boat's D-PN constitutes a rating certificate, and owners and/or skippers are subject to the requirements of ISAF RRS 78 - Compliance

with Class Rules.

Races: Held in Willoughby Bay, Norfolk (also known as Little Bay) from the 13th View

public boat ramp. The warning Signal for the first class will be scheduled for

1830.

Skippers' Meeting: Wednesday, May 28th after the first race. Sailing Instructions and other

important information will be distributed and discussed at the boat ramp.
