The second Membership Meeting of the year (15 March) will be held at the Big Ugly Brewery in Chesapeake. Jim Miller of Doyle Sails is our guest speaker and will be talking about emergency sail repair. Craft beer and pizza. What a great way to recover from a Monday and Tuesday. How can you make it better you ask? Show up, get involved. Honestly, much of the fun is in the scheming, planning, and comradery when planning events. We get to know more of our fellow members and they get to know us. Winter will be grinding to a close, so get involved.

Where can you get involved?

The Cruise Planning Meeting is being held Sunday 28 February, at Mary and Joe Greblunas home on Willoughby Spit. See the Cruising News for details. Get involved... let your voice be heard. Is there a port, creek, bay, marina, cove, or chunk of water you've been wanting to explore or re-visit? Get on the schedule and have the club join you on your expedition.

BBSA sponsors the Cape Charles Cup, the ultimate race for cruisers. If like me, you don't want to race the house so to speak, contact me or Randy Goodman (Race Chairman) to get involved. We need all sorts of help for the pre-race party, race day party, and awards party. Don't forget race committee, chase boats, safety boats, etc. To give you an idea of the size of the event, the annual budget is almost \$30K, most of which is covered by very generous donors. In addition, we have given \$5K per year to Sail Nauticus in support of sailing for inner city children and teens. BBSA also sponsors the Neptune's Atlantic Cup Regatta. This is our only offshore race and it is held in conjunction with the Neptune Festival. Although the race was blown out by inclement weather last year, Jerry Pattenaude (Race Chairman) held a race of sorts at the Raven Restaurant (a major sponsor). If you didn't sign up to race or help with the race, you missed a great party. (Randy Goodman won the impromptu race at the keg... ask him about details).

Another PHRF BBSA regatta, the Cape Henry Cup (Scott Almond Race Chairman), is a unique long distance race where we sail through both openings in the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel. It's not easy... I've tried it several times (hyperbole, I wasn't racing) and Mr. Yanmar was called upon for his expertise. Just finishing under sail is serious bragging rights.

This regatta is fun and casual. We sponsor the Broad Bay Regatta (Jerry Pattenaude Race Chairman), a small boat/one-design race that includes dinghies and multi-hulls. - - PHRF of the Chesapeake for your Valid Rating a necessary evil for racing. As of right now, the 2016 application is not ready yet; check back at http://www.phrfchesbay.org/. Usually, it is a two-step process; fill out the electronic application/renewal form and then use the link below it to pay online. Both new applications AND renewals must use BOTH steps (you can't just pay for a renewal without submitting the renewal form). Put BBSA in the blank for Primary Club and put your (newly acquired?) CBYRA membership number in the blank for CBYRA.

- -CCV Their racing membership automatically enters you in all of their races for the season (except for Southern Bay Race Week); saves time, money, and headaches!! Worst case, join as a club member to get your copy of the annual racing bible (the CCV Racing Guide) to have information on every significant race in this area. http://www.ccvracing.org/Membership/membership.html. ****US SAILING ONE DAY RACE MANAGEMENT SEMINAR, scheduled for Saturday, February 20, 2016, at Hampton Yacht Club, Victoria Boulevard, Hampton, Virginia, is now open for on-line registration. This is a great course for those interested in learning about race management as well as the US SAILING race officer certification program. The seminar meets requirements for Club Race Officer certification or renewal. Lead instructor is John McCarthy, USSA National Judge and certified Regional Race Officer. The seminar is posted to the USSA calendar (http://www.ussailing.org/race-officials/become-a-race-official/race-officer-seminar-calendar/) and registration is now open. Scroll down until you come to the February 20, 2016, seminar at HYC, and follow the prompts. On-line registration is encouraged. IF you have questions or need assistance with the on-line registration, contact Lin McCarthy at 757-850-4225. On-line registration will close on February 14th.

\$60 seminar fee includes refreshments and a buffet lunch plus all materials. Check-in opens at 7:30 am and the seminar begins promptly at 8:00 am and finishes at 6:00 pm. The guest speaker will be Jeff Rogers, from Old Point Comfort Yacht Club's (OPCYC) Pointer Maritime University (PMU).

OPCYC calls its ambitious training program "Pointer Maritime University", or "PMU" for short.

For the past ten years or so, OPCYC has conducted a whole mess of boating-related training, much of which has been led or coordinated by Jeff. Jeff's program at PMU is clearly a model for boating education for other yacht clubs and boating organizations.

Jeff has graciously agreed to share his knowledge of the impacts of tides and currents on sailboats.

We have a second short presentation:

Maritime Pilot and LCSA Skipper, Kevin Hartz will describe interactions with sailboats from a Pilot/Large Ship Master's perspective, to include right of way IAW COLREGs refresher; dangers of crossing the ship's bow; suggested radio communications; etc.
