RACING NEWS

While we started the racing season with cancellations and postponements, we finished with a BANG!!! Highlights for 2020:

- Chris French and the crew of Elixir were named the BBSA Big Boat Skipper of the Year at the BBSA Annual Banquet at the Cavalier Yacht and Country Club. Their accomplishments helped them get 1st Place overall in the PHRF B Fleet of the 2019 Southern Bay Distance Racing Series.
- Because of Covid-19, BBSA postponed the Little Creek Sailing Association and Willoughby Racers weeknight race series through the end of May but we were finally able to start both series in June. To facilitate opening the season we, in consort with the other clubs in the Southern Bay, implemented COVID-19 related modifications and protocols to include reducing the number of people on a race committee utilizing an automatic race starter system eliminating prep flags, requiring skippers to sign waivers consistent with other sailing clubs in the Southern Bay, making masks, gloves and sanitizer available to crew members and limiting crew size consistent with PHRF ratings.
- The **Cape Henry Cup** race, the first of the four CBYRA sanctioned races sponsored by BBSA was scheduled for Saturday, May 16, but was postponed and later cancelled in light of the Governor's Stay at Home Order.
- BBSA and NYCC teamed up and ran two small boat regattas on Saturday, June 27 and Sunday,
 June 28, at NYCC. On Saturday, the team ran BBSA's 58th Broad Bay Regatta consisting of 4
 races for the Laser, Laser Radial, and Hampton One Design classes, and 3 races for the Moth
 class. Sunday, the team ran the NYCC Wolcott Memorial Regatta consisting of 3 races. The final
 results for both days were combined for final standings.
- The much-anticipated Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup, the second and third of the four CBYRA sanctioned races sponsored by BBSA, was held August 15-16, but because of COVID-19, we did not stay over in Cape Charles. The race instead consisted of two days of racing off Norfolk and Hampton shores allowing racers to return to their homeports. Saturday, downpours caused a two-hour delay but 23 racers came out for the race. Sunday, the weather improved and the number of racers increased to 41. It was FUN, CHALLENGING and EXHILARATING!!! In 2021, we hope to return to our previous format of racing from Little creek to Cape Charles, an overnight stay in Cape Charles, and racing back to Buckroe.
- What a difference a week makes on the Chesapeake Bay in August!!! We went from big wind, rolling seas, and rain for the Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup to little or no wind and boats anchored for 30 or more minutes after the start for the Bold Mariner Cup. Of the twenty-two (22) boats entered, sixteen (16) boats showed up to race a shortened course off Ocean View on Saturday. Six were able to finish within the time limit. Little Creek Sailing Association (LCSA) held on to the title for another year.

- BBSA was undeterred by the cancellation of the **Virginia Beach Neptune Festival** by the City. The Festival has served as the lynchpin for the BBSA Neptune's Atlantic Regatta, the fourth of the four CBYRA sanctioned races sponsored by BBSA. While Neptune took a COVID-19 break, we moved forward with the **BBSA Atlantic Regatta** on Saturday, September 26. The format remained the same with staggered start and all. The race started with a scattered drizzle and wind that offered only "light breezes to invisible breezes" throughout the starting sequence of the pursuit race. 17 boats of the 20 registered boats started and finished. The first leg from Little Creek to Cape Henry was upwind and the last leg of the 15 nm race from Cape Henry to 24th Street was a reach. The race was thoroughly enjoyed by beach goers from Little Creek to 24th Street!
- BBSA racers collected half the awards in the 2020 Southern Bay Distance Racing Series
 (SBDRS) sponsored by HYC, NYCC, OPCYC, CCVR, and BBSA! The awards were presented by
 BBSA at the annual Cruising Club of Virginia (CCVR) Awards and Crew Party held the afternoon
 of October 24th at Youth Sailing Virginia on Fort Monroe. It was a fun COVID-19 compliant
 event. If you're not familiar with Youth Sailing Virginia check it out!
- In addition to the Thursday Night Series, Willoughby Racers enjoy two weekend regattas, the first of which is the **Willoughby Memorial Race** on October 3 in memory of local sailors who have gone on to their reward. The race features a staggered start. There were 14 finishers. Following the race, light refreshments were served in the Willoughby Harbor Marina parking lot. Awards for the race were handed out at the Hot-Buttered Rum Race in November.
- For the other WR weekend regatta, the Hot Buttered Rum Race, there were lighter than light breezes on Saturday, November 7. Appropriately, there are 2 classes Gold Label & Silver Label. Following the race, hot-buttered rum was served and war stories exchanged along with food and refreshments at the Willoughby Racers End-of-Season Party in the Willoughby Harbor Marina parking lot.
- LCSA couldn't get enough this year! Since their Wednesday night series was cut short on the front end of the season, they decided to add a Series 4, the "informal" Mano-a-Mano Series from September 30 to October 28 on the back end. But no, that still wasn't enough so they added a Series 5, the "informal" Turkey Trot Series from November 1 to 29. Phew, I think they're finally done for the year.
- LCSA also added the "informal" Veteran's Day Race. Per Randy Goodman, six LCSA boats enjoyed the race which started at 1530. The weather was tremendous. Warm air in the upper 70s; offshore winds 16 gusting to 24 knots, with absolutely no chop. Fabulous conditions for racing. Maybe this becomes a regular event going forward?

As I turn the controls over to **next year's Racing Fleet Captain, Jay Thompson**, I want to thank you all for the opportunity to be the **2020 Racing Fleet Captain**.



Despite these stressors, many cruisers came away from the weekend event believing that it was one of the best Grand Illumination cruises in the 12 years that the event has been running.

With a sharpened focus on balancing safety with the pleasures of cruising, we hosted a socially distant, COVID responsible cruise to Norfolk's Waterside Marina. 9 boats and several land yachters made the trip and were able to enjoy early fall-like weather, good food, and even better company. COVID-19 Marina Impacts:



Information about various navigational concerns of note in VA, provided by Andy Spittler (copied from BoatUS.com) (most of the membership are already aware of... but in case you aren't):

VA – Thimble Shoal Channel Dredging:

Starting approximately 25 November 2020 and continuing until approximately 30 June 2021, Weeks Marine Hopper Dredge "MAGDALEN" and support equipment will be operating in the Thimble Shoal Channel (between Thimble Lighted Bell Buoy 9 (LLNR 9255) and Thimble Shoal Lighted Buoy 7 (LLNR 9235) stopping west of Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel). All dredged material will be transported to the Dam Neck Ocean Disposal Site — DNODS - Cells 5, 6 & 7. Dredging operations will continue twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven days per week basis. The dredge will monitor VHF-FM channels 13 and 16. For more information or questions, contact Matt Henry at 985-237-5050. Chart 12256 (5th District LNM Week 45/2020)

New: VA--Rudee Inlet Survey:

Survey dated 19 Nov 2020. Shoaling remains on the inside, 300' West of the ends of the jetties with a new least depth 8 feet at MLLW. (5th District LNM Week 47/2020)

VA - Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel Construction Hazard:

Construction on the North Island of the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel has begun and 27 steel poles will be installed around the North Island that are 6 inches in diameter and extending vertically out of the water 3 to 8 feet. The steel poles will be marked with flashing white lights and retroreflective tape. Mariners shall use caution when transiting in vicinity of the North Island of the HRBT. For more information or question, contact the Hampton Roads Connector Partners at 757-373-4799. (5th District LNM Week 44/2020)

VA – Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel Construction:

The second phase of the Hampton Roads Connector Partners construction will begin on the west side and parallel with the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnels, and will start at the north side at the Hampton Roads land side extending to the south side at the Willoughby land side. There will be at any given time several crane and barges along with several material barges as well as the tugs Uncle Mike, Robert T, Angelina Autumn, Miss Morgan and the Seaward 8, Seaward 9, and the Seaward 12. The following crew boats will be on site Seaward 10, Seaward 5, and the Brittany Lynn along with several outboard motor type safety vessels. All of the job site vessels will be standing by on VHF channels 13 & 16. This notice to mariners will be updated from time to time as per the scope of the project increases. All barges will be lighted at night by solid white lights on their four corners. All floating mooring buoys shall be lighted with flashing white lights. All mooring piles will be lighted at night with solid white lights on each pile. All mariners when in the vicinity of the job site and approaching or leaving the area of operations, should remain a safe distance away from any and all buoys and or mooring piles. VA – Norfolk Naval Station Dredging:

The Dredge ESSEX and attendant plant and equipment will commence mobilization operations in Hampton Roads on or about October 22, 2020. Pipeline laying operations will commence first between the Craney Island Disposal Area and Norfolk Naval Station in the vicinity of Norfolk Harbor Reach and the Craney Island Flats. A submerged pipeline will be placed from the northeast corner of Craney Island to the western edge of the Norfolk Harbor Channel in the vicinity of Elizabeth River Channel Lighted Buoy 8 (LLNR 9500). The ESSEX will then commence dredging a trench across Norfolk Harbor Channel, on or about October 27, 2020. The trench dredging should take approximately 2 days. Once completed, a submerged pipeline will be placed in the trench and terminate at the head of Norfolk Naval Station Pier 9. The ESSEX will then perform dredging within the Norfolk Naval Station. The project is expected to continue until approximately January 20, 2021. The Dredge Operator will standby on channels 13 and 16 VHF-FM. Traffic should call 30 minutes prior to expected time of passage. For any emergencies, the dredge operator can be reached at 757-353-0455. Chart 12245 (5th District LNM Week 43/2020)

NEW: VA –Naval Station Norfolk Military Training:

Naval Station Norfolk will be conducting training 8 December 2020, from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm, directly North of Craney Island in approximate position 36 55' 45" N 76 22' 00"W. If necessary, vessels may contact the training vessels on VHF-FM 14 and 72 or contact MA1 Benner at 808-600-1084. Chart 12245 (5th District LNM Week 47/2020)

VA – Churchland Bridge, Western Branch, Elizabeth River, Replacement: Extending until Mar 2023 McLean Contracting Company will be conducting bridge demolition, and replacement of the Churchland Bridge on the Western Branch of the Elizabeth River. Signs have been installed on both sides of the bridge worded "OVERHEAD BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION 500 FEET AHEAD". A temporary pile crane trestle will be extending approximately 600ft from either shoreline on the North side of the bridge, installed parallel to the bridge. Crane barges, spud barges and tugs will be on scene throughout the project and may be contacted on VHF-FM Channels 03, 13 and 16. VA – Portsmouth Waterfront Seawall Construction:

Crofton Construction will be will be conducting repairs to the seawall located in the Elizabeth River at the following locations: N36° 50′20″ and W76°17′45″ and N36° 50′25″ and W76°17′46″. Beginning November 09, 2020 and continuing until January 31, 2021 or until complete. Construction operations will include, barge and crane operations, in conjunction with general marine construction. Barges and vessels will be moored on site with employees working over the side on small floats at times along with crew boats. The construction equipment will be confined to the barges, with small crew boats, working in the vicinity. Vessels are requested to proceed in this area with caution and causing no wake. Crews will be monitoring VHF-FM Channels 13 & 16. For more information or questions, contact Olga Mileyko at 757-397-1131. Chart 12253 (5th District LNM Week 43/2020)

VA – I-64 High Rise Bridge Construction, AICW Mile 7.1:

An engineering firm, on behalf of Virginia Department of Transportation are performing bridge construction at I-64 High Rise Bridge over Elizabeth River Southern Branch, mile 7.1, in Chesapeake, VA. Mariners should expect construction activity and related equipment in the vicinity of the bridge 24 hours a day; 7 days a week. A crane barge is currently being used within the navigation channel to complete the final stages of bridge fender system work and is removed from the channel at the end of each shift. Work vessels may be reached on VHF-FM channel 13. The project manager can be reached at (757) 579-8400. Mariners should use caution and proceed at a safe speed to minimize wake for work vessels when transiting the area.
