COMMODORE'S CORNER

Happy November everyone!

I am writing to you from my bunk on the Schooner Virginia. October started for me on this ship in the Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race and is ended at the Sultana Downrigging and Bluegrass Festival in Chestertown, Maryland. The Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race is an annual event that focuses on education of the Chesapeake Bay's resources and conservation of the Bay. The ship sailed with 50 school children (5th and 8th grade) while in Baltimore where the children participated in teaching stations that focused on environment, marine life and physics. The race down the bay took over 39 hours due to a lack of wind. We drifted by the Calvert Cliff gas piers with 1.2 knots of boat speed. Wind picked up and the Virginia had over 10 knots of boat speed at the finish line. We won our fleet beating Pride of Baltimore II by about 2 minutes in corrected time. Not much considering we had raced 117 miles. I left the ship and drove to Annapolis for a dinner with the Ocean Cruising Club and the US Sailboat Show. I had so much fun seeing BBSA members who came by the Evolution Sails booth and the Jeanneau owners' party! If you do not know what the Ocean Cruising Club is and you are a cruiser, you should check it out. To be a qualifying full member you must complete a 1,000 nm passage on a boat 70 ft long or less. If you have not done a qualifying passage, you can be an associate member. The club has over 3,000 members in 86 countries, port officers in ports all over the world and is a great resource for cruisers. I am a full member and can sponsor anyone interested in the club. I left the boat show, measured a boat for new sails, picked up an international judge from the airport and walked right into J111 Worlds at Hampton Yacht Club. Our very own Bob Magoon was on the race committee for the week. We had a ton of fun together at the event. J111 Worlds ended, the boat managers packed up the boats and I hopped on the Schooner Virginia. Chestertown, MD is a gorgeous town. The people are so kind here. The coffee shop, speakeasy, restaurants and walking tour of the town are wonderful. And if you come during downrigging week, the Bluegrass bands are fabulous. This town should be on everyone's cruising destination list.

We had a board meeting in October and the synopsis is BBSA is doing great! We had a fun October meeting at Nauticus where Cape Henry Cup race awards were handed out. Scott Almond emptied out his garage by giving out past unclaimed trophies. Our November meeting will be at the ODU Sailing Center on November 16th. This meeting is "Friendsgiving". It is an optional white elephant gift exchange and potluck. Last time we did this was in 2019 and I never thought I could laugh as hard as I did during the gift exchange. We will be voting on the new officers for 2022. It is time for me to not be Commodore as it has been a long pandemic filled 2 years for me. I hope to see everyone there! This boat is a fiberglass Steam Launch. The hull particulars are LOA: 22'3", Beam: 7'10 1/2", Draft 2'2".

Located in Yorktown, VA and kept on a lift under the cover of an open boathouse. The price includes sea trial with a lesson on how to run the steam engine. The seller will be accessible for further advice and consultation by e-mail or text, if needed.

The engine is a Strath Steam Works SWAN compound steam engine (in-line) which is 3'' and 5'' bore with a stroke of 4''. The engine drives a 20'' x 30'' three blade propeller, connected by a $1 \frac{1}{4}''$ shaft to the engine.

The boiler is a vertical fire tube, Hobby Steam Boilers, Limited Model VFT-40 wood fired. The boiler has a brass covered stainless steel stack on top of a steel hood and base. The boiler is lagged with mahogany and trimmed in brass. A four-chime whistle is mounted above the canopy.

The hydraulic steering system is by wheel with two stations one forward and one starboard.

The deck of the boat is a fiberglass component, that is cored for stiffness. Seating for six to eight persons, with perimeter benches. The captain occupies a portion of the starboard bench. The boat can be run single handed from this location.

The deck hardware is bronze/brass. A flag pole on bow and stern.

A fiberglass canopy on solid brass tubing framework. A scalloped edge of canvas around the entire canopy that is attached by snaps so that it can be removed. There are nine drop down curtains with transparent panels, that can be rolled up to the canopy.

There are solid brass navigation lights.

Price includes trailer a tandem (2) axle trailer, with surge brakes on the front axle.


