ROUND THE LIGHTS RACE this coming Saturday, October 17. Old Point Comfort Yacht Club presents the 'Round the Lights each year. This is a fall favorite on the southern Bay. Classes: PHRF A, B, C and Non-Spin (double headsails allowed), Multi-Hull, and Cruising. It is a staggered start, aka chase start or pursuit race, event with a reverse handicap starting sequence. The NOTICE OF RACE and SAILING INSTRUCTIONS are posted at https://www.opcyc.org/rtl and contain official event information regarding times, time limits, course, start area, current entries, how to enter, time limits, entry deadlines, etc. Boat starting time assignments will be posted five days before the race at the OPCYC website and in the starting area before the first warning signal. Entry fee is \$45. Enter NOW so you can get your assigned starting time! There will be an after-race party and awards ceremony outside the OPCYC clubhouse - 1730=festivities, 1830=awards.
