ROUND THE LIGHTS RACE RESULTS: As far as we know, BOTH LIGHTHOUSES are still standing! Fifty-two (52) boats entered Saturday's 25<sup>th</sup> 'Round The Lights Race, the event sponsored every year by Old Point Comfort Yacht Club. Of those entered, 32 successfully sailed the course, which required each boat to round each lighthouse, Middle Ground Light and Thimble Shoal Light, before returning to the finish in Mill Creek. The glitches in the E-Z Pass turned out to be a 15-20+ knot NNE wind, cantankerous seas (especially on the Thimble Shoal legs), an unusually big tide and accompanying current, and the first really chilly temps of fall. And, there were equipment failures (a mast broken in two places on one boat) and crew battling cold and wet conditions. Southern Bay racers, though, did fine and strengthened their resolve in anticipation of fall frostbiting! This was a pursuit aka staggered start 18nm race – slower rated boats start first.
