MEMORIAL DAY - A TIME TO REMEMBER THOSE WHO HAVE STOOD FOR US ALL.

It's 120 nautical miles from start to finish of the **DOWN THE BAY RACE**, and every boat in the fleet has to do them all. To win the <u>Virginia Cruising Cup</u>, a boat must be a monohull that sailed in a PHRF fleet, and must have the fastest corrected PHRF time. This year, that was **ALLEGIANT**, J42, skippered by **Albert Bossar** of HHSA, Shady Side, Maryland. ALLEGIANT completed the course in 22hrs:28mins:04sec., and her handicap corrected to 0:23:02. The J42 picked up 1st place silver for the PHRF B class and, of course, was first in the 9 boat PHRF Division. <u>ALLEGIANT Crew</u>: **Albert Bossar** - owner/skipper; **James Branson** - navigator; **Hannah Dickmyer** - main trimmer; **Noah Martin** – bow; **Maryline O'Shea** – floater; **Adam Rybczynski** – mast; and, **Jordan Stock** - helm

The **Robert M. Ravin Memorial Trophy**, awarded to the first to finish monohull in the DTB fleet, was captured by **ENDORPHIN**, Soto 40, skippered by **Erik Wulff**, also of HHSA/St. Mary's College, home ported at Dallas, TX. *ENDORPHIN* skipped across the finish line at 06:06:53 having taken 19hrs:56Mins:53secs to go the 120 nm. *Endorphin* is entered in SBRW and will be racing in the Super A class, in the PHRF Division, this coming Friday-Saturday-Sunday.

Early entries to DTB numbered as high as 35, but on Friday morning, fourteen (14) boats started the 72nd running of the **Down the Bay Race** and 13 finished, the 120 nm dash amid weather alerts and some brief storms, one of reported 30knt winds. One boat suffered mechanical difficulties and retired early on. Thirteen (13) monohulls finished (9 PHRF, 2 CHESS and 2 ORC); & 1 Multihull). *Glory Days*, sailed by **Karen Roberts**, of BBSA/ Norfolk sailed down the Bay, the only multihull participant. In addition to Karen Roberts, 4 southern Bay monohull skippers and crew raced: *Challenge Accepted*, **Michael Cummings** (NY&CC); *Elixir,* **Chris French** (was 2nd overall in the PHRF Div) (BBSA); *Red Frog,* **Randy Goodman** (BBSA); and *Afterthough*t, **Craig Wright** (FBYC). This 58 nm race out the mouth of the Bay via the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel channels sends the boats around the Chesapeake Bay Light Tower and back to the finish line off Ft Monroe. CCV cautions in the race circular that "the Chesapeake Light Tower is 1 mile beyond the 12 mile zone in international waters so check your insurance coverage." There is a required Skippers meeting to be held Friday the 17th at 6pm at the HYC Gazebo..
