STARTING TIME: Staggered starts, beginning at 1300. (Fastest boat starts last!) See below.

INSTRUCTIONS: The start time for each yacht will be posted at the registration table in the HYC lounge. <u>Starting times are</u> <u>established by applying a PHRF handicap allowance (CR) plus a Non-Spin credit (if applicable)</u>. Boats with Non-Spinnaker credits may fly double-headsails if they choose. Starting on-time is the sole responsibility of the skipper. <u>Time signals will be</u> <u>announced on VHF-72 at 1255 and again at 1300</u>. Boats starting prematurely will be hailed via VHF-72 and required to restart. <u>No Flag "X" will be displayed</u>. After starting, racing is boat-for-boat (first to finish wins!). The RC will record and post the order of finish. To relieve congestion and facilitate identification of premature starters, a yacht may not maneuver within 100 yards of the starting line until 4 minutes before its starting time.

Post-Race and Awards: There will be libations and hot chili for purchase in the HYC Dockside Lounge after the race. Join the post-race fun! Awards for PHRF A, B, and C per CCV Race Instructions, plus the annual spittoon for the first PHRF boat in will be presented at the HYC Annual Awards Night on Tuesday, December 6.

SPIRIT of NORFOLK, rescue awards: Eighteen (18) public service awards have been presented to good Samaritan vessels in the *SPIRIT OF NORFOLK* incident this past year. The U.S. Coast Guard presented awards including the Distinguished Public Service Award, meritorious Public Service Award, and Certificate of Merit. **Just gCaptain Daily: Your Daily Maritime News** covered the presentations and reviewed the incident: *"The sightseeing vessel was on a cruise on the Elizabeth River near Naval Station Norfolk when it <u>caught fire</u> with 108 people on board, many of whom were school children on a field trip. The fire caused the vessel to become disabled and adrift in the main ship channel. The crew issued a mayday call and 15 commercial vessels from the area responded to assist with rescue and firefighting efforts".
