MITCH BRINDLEY has been awarded the Nathanael G. Herreshoff Trophy. Part of the information Scuttlebutt shared about Mitch's accomplishments follows here: "After serving as president of the Intercollegiate Sailing Association for 21 years, this year's Nathanael G. Herreshoff Trophy winner, Mitch Brindley, will be stepping down in May. The Association and its member organizations host over 300 regattas a year for approximately 5,000 members. Under his leadership the Association has grown in membership, secured increased funding in the form of title sponsorships from industry partners, and increased participation in national championships . . . . PHRF SPLITS for SOUTHERN BAY 2023. Mayo Tabb, Southern Bay VP for PHRF of the Chesapeake has confirmed the up-to-date PHRF Fleet Splits approved by a vote of the PHRF delegates. Both the North and South Divisions of Region 4 (the southern Bay) will have identical splits. Here are the Region 4 PHRF Classes:

A - Up to 99

B - 100-151

C - 152 and Up

N - All

PHRF Cruising Class (CCS & CCNS) – All (replaces Corinthian Class)

PHRF Short-Handed - All

- You most likely know, but just in case, the new Race Captain for CCVR is **Andy Armstrong**, a well-known accomplished skipper who sails *Virginia H III* in PHRF A.

Greg and Carie Cutter race their Andrews 28, *DIABLO*, in the southern Bay and beyond. When he is not sailing, Greg is engaged as an oceanographer with Old Dominion University. Here is Greg Cutter's description of what he was doing this past January. He wrote, "I'm off Antarctica at 67 S, 115 W below the Antarctic Circle. We continue our sampling at different locations but are surrounded by big and small icebergs. The wind has been howling since we got south of 40 degrees and down here where there are no continents to stop them and depending on the passage of lows, the wind is out of the west as is the major current, the Antarctic Circumpolar Current that flows to the east./northeast. We're in the austral summer and the sun barely goes down plus it's a balmy freezing point (32 F or 0 C) every day, plus snowing. Once and awhile the sun comes out. I'll be back on 30 January with lots of stories to tell." Dr. Gregory Cutter, Professor and Eminent Scholar of Oceanography.
