In all probability the as yet unpublished **new safety standards**, to which US Sailing and PHRF of the Chesapeake will subscribe, will include requirements for **Man Over Board** drills. So, if the sunny March day comes along and skipper and crew are on the water, use the opportunity to get'er done. It's a must even if the governing authorities had not developed the MOB requirement. **NOTE: PHRF of the Chesapeake President, Mike Mullarky** expects to have the *US Safety Equipment Requirements as adopted by PHRF of the Chesapeake* posted at the website in a few days or so. These requirements replace the previous 4P, 5P, and 6P standards and include some significant changes. Instead the levels of compliance will be titled *Ches Bay* (old 4P) and *Nearshore* (old 5P and 6P).

certificates. *Southern Bay Race Week officials encourage racers to go ahead and enter, even though they have not yet received their 2014 ratings.* All rating information will be reconciled as skippers receive official word from PHRF.
