Against all odds and everything Mother Nature had to throw at them, J70 racers proved to be a tough bunch.** They got in two races on Saturday before deciding to shorten the regatta to a single day. On Saturday there was a narrow window from late morning through early afternoon in conditions that tested skills and fortitude of the 18 who raced. Predictions for Sunday conditions, wind and waves, let alone even colder temperatures, were beyond the pale. **Will Welles**, (2,1) Providence, RI, claimed the 2014 title, winning a tie breaker over **Bruce Golison**, (1,2) Rossmore, CA. **Thomas Bowen** (5,3) Charleston, SC won the tie breaker for 3<sup>rd</sup> over Cole Allsopp (5,3) Annapolis. Southern Bay racers also finishing in the top 10 were: 5<sup>th</sup> (4,4)-**Blake and Lud Kimbrough**, Providence, RI with FBYC roots; 6<sup>th</sup> (5,7)-**Neil Ford**, Hampton - HYC; 7<sup>th</sup> (7,6)-**Ron Thompson**, Yorktown – HYC; 9<sup>th</sup> (8,10)-**Dan and Gannon Troutman**, Gloucester; and, 10<sup>th</sup> (11,9)-**Drake Johnstone**, Charlottesville-FBYC. **As is the tradition, the annual GABOON RACE, set this year for Sunday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, marks the end of the 2014 racing season.** This will be the 37<sup>th</sup> running of the Gaboon. Phil Briggs is the visionary who had part in creating the race and has been on hand to chair every single Gaboon. And, he will undoubtedly race his J36, *Feather*, this year, too. So, mark this particular **Sunday (Dec 7<sup>th</sup>)** on your calendar, gather all your friends and crew-wannabees, along with your crew, and send in your entry to Race Committee (Gaboon Race), HYC, 4704 Victoria Blvd, Hampton, VA 23669. Entry fee is \$25 (\$30 for non-USSA members), checks payable to HYC. The deadline for entries is Race Day (December 7<sup>th</sup>) at 12:30pm. The Gaboon is a staggered start (pursuit) race, beginning at 1300. Tradition dictates that the start/finish line be between the HYC docks and the blue rock on the HU shore. The course is pre-determined and in the harbor. Individual start times for boats will be posted at the registration table on race day in the HYC Dockside Lounge. Boats must have a current PHRF certificate with at least a PHRF Near-Shore rating. And, the PHRF number of crew limitations do not apply; so, like the song says, “...*Pack up the babies, Grab the old ladies, Everyone goes...*” [Neil Diamond, *Brother Love's Traveling Salvation Show*] For additional info, contact Phil Briggs at (757) 723-5477.

**Southern Bay sailors raced in the Cressy High School Singlehanded National Championship Regatta** in Bellingham, Washington, this past weekend. **Alexander Hanna** (Poquoson High School), who finished 7<sup>th</sup> overall, and **Gray Kiger III** (Norfolk Academy), who took a 14<sup>th</sup> overall, competed in the Laser radial fleet. **Eric Roos** (Atlee High School) in Richmond, VA, competed in the Laser Full Rig fleet and finished 14<sup>th</sup> overall. Each fleet was comprised of the best 18 high school sailors in the country who qualified through an elimination process to sail for the national title.
