The consensus among racers in the Moonlight Triangle is that it was a nice night to race and the cool, southern Chesapeake Bay was pleasant place to be. The PHRF A and PHRF B fleets sailed at 21.7 nm course, while the PHRF C and PHRF Non-Spin fleets went 14.8 nm. Breezes were light-ish to moderate, (7 to 10 knts most of the way) and all of the boats finished before 10pm. Phil Briggs' J36, Feather, chose to "go to the beach" and picked up valuable time in that current and corrected to first in the largest fleet. Ian Hill's Sitella was first to finish the longer course, but corrected to third place when all was said and done. In all, 22 boats started the race and all finished.
